Welcome to the Town of Bradley

History

Before 1776, Bradley was a part of the territory that belonged to the Penobscot Indians (Terratine Tribe). Probably the first white men that made their way up the river came to fish, to hunt and to trap. They then went further north or back from where they came. It is possible that the first permanent settlers here had built cabins on Great Works Stream as early as 1783. Eventually in 1825 the settlers held a meeting for this purpose and #4 Indian purchases was then called Great Works.

As the sawmills flourished the town began to grow other businesses were established -- general stores, grist mills, copper shops, dry goods stores, dance hall, livery stables, taverns, and several blacksmith shops.

As a result of the plantation's success a movement was soon started to incorporate as a town. The legislature of 1834 was petitioned and on February 3, 1835, Bradley was officially incorporated as a town in the State of Maine

Town of Bradley Volunteer Fire Department

The Fire Department currently has 20 members serving our town. The Department is always looking for new members to join and help protect our town; no experience is necessary as they offer ongoing trainings twice a month as well as a monthly business meeting to keep everyone current on the news of the department. They also have a junior fire fighter program for our town residents ages 15-18.

The normal curbside solid waste (trash) pickup schedule is **every Thursday beginning at 7:00 a.m.**

Recycling-

The normal curbside recycling pickup schedule is **the third Thursday of every month beginning at 7:00 am.** The Town offers single stream recycling allowing residents to place all their recycling into one container. The Town provides free recycle identifying stickers which can be used on any container.
