



**ORDER FOR SERVICE
 BY PUBLICATION**

This court has reviewed the motion of the plaintiff for service by publication pursuant to Rule 4(g) of the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure.

It is **ORDERED** that service be made upon the other party by publishing a copy of this Order once a week for three (3) successive weeks, in *The Penobscot Times*, a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the action is pending.

It is **FURTHER ORDERED** that the party being served by publication appear and serve an answer to the motion or complaint on the other party at the above address. The answer must be filed with the court within forty-one (41) days after the first publication of this Order.

It is **FURTHER ORDERED** that the moving party mail a copy of the Order as published to the other party at the party's last known address.

Failure to serve an answer will cause judgment by default to be entered, granting relief sought in the motion or complaint.

PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION: IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above named parties be:

1. Prohibited from transferring, encumbering, concealing, selling or otherwise disposing of any property of either of the parties, except in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life, without the written consent of the court.

 ficer spoke with the tenant of the residence in question and obtained a promise that the noise would stop.

Thursday, Feb. 21 - At 01:56:30, Officer Fournier visited Howard Street on a noise complaint that involved loud banging, loud voices and loud music. On arriving at the scene, Officer Fournier spoke with several males and two females about the noise. One of the two females, a 17 year-old, admitted to having imbibed alcohol during the course of the evening. The other female, Marisa O'Clare, 20, was summoned for furnishing a place for minors to consume alcohol and possession of alcohol by a minor....at 11:45:06, a former resident of Stillwater Avenue called to report that her ex-boyfriend owned two "dangerous, vicious" pit bulls, one of which had already bitten her 13 year-old son. The complainant advised that there was also a half-golden retriever/half-pit bull liv-

ing at her ex-boyfriend's residence and that the other dogs had killed and eaten one of its puppies. Officers visited the address and spoke with the complainant's ex-boyfriend, who told them that his dogs had not killed and eaten any puppies. He said that he had given away all of the golden retriever/pit bull mix dog's puppies except one....at 18:19:07, a complainant reported that

there was a disabled vehicle parked on Main Street in Bradley and should be moved before someone driving around the corner ran into it.

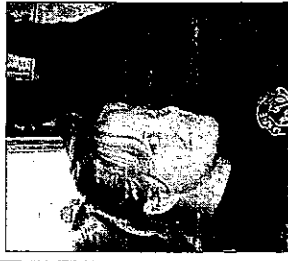

Town Dog Ordinance

THE TOWN OF BRADLEY HEREBY ORDAINS that the following ordinance shall be adopted:

Section 1. Definitions:

As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise indicates:

- A. DOG- shall be intended to mean both male and female dogs.
- B. OWNER- shall be intended to mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning keeping, harboring or in possession of or having the control of a dog, the parent or parents or guardian of a minor who owns, keeps or has in possession a dog.
- C. AT LARGE- shall be intended to mean off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person by means of personal presence and attention as will reasonably control the conduct of such dog either by leash, cord, chain or "at heel", or under commend.
- D. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER- the Town Manager shall appoint an animal control officer for the purpose of enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance and the performance of the duties and responsibilities conferred upon animal control officers under Maine State statute. The animal control officer shall be authorized to issue compliance orders and court summons as required by this ordinance and Maine State statute.

Section 2. Running at Large

- A. No owner shall cause or permit any dog to run at large with the Town of Bradley. A dog, while in or on any public way or place shall be under restraint of a leash of not more than eight feet in length.
- B. Nothing in this section shall require the leashing of any dog while it is on the property of its owner.

Section 3. Barking or Howling Dogs

No owner shall keep or harbor any dog within the Town of Bradley which by frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity and duration as to disturb the peace, quite and good order of the Town.

#### Section 4. Removal and Disposal of Dog Excrement

- A. It shall be a violation of this section for any owner to fail to immediately remove and dispose of any feces left cast or deposited by the dog upon the premises of any public way or place or upon the property of others.
- B. This section shall not apply to a dog accompanying any handicapped person who, by reason of his/her handicap, is physically unable to comply with the requirements of this section.

#### Section 5. License

A suitable tag showing the year the dog license was issued in accordance with the State of Maine statutes and bearing such other data as the commissioner of agriculture may prescribe shall be securely attached to a collar which must be worn at all times by the dog for which the license was issued. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove such tag or to place either a collar or tag on any dog not described or for which the license was not issued.

#### Section 6. Fees

Any owner of a dog that has been transported by the Animal Control officer will be charged a \$20.00 fee plus any mileage expenses, boarding and medical expenses for the care of the dog. Failure to pay such a fee within 30 days of the billing date is a violation of this ordinance.

#### Section 7. Penalty

Upon a signed and sworn written complaint by any person, a duly qualified law enforcement official, animal control officer or person acting in that capacity for the Town of Bradley may investigate and may give written notice to the owner that they have been found in violation of this Ordinance. The written notice shall be made part of the complaint. Upon continuance of such violation, the owner found in violation of this ordinance by a court shall be subject to fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), and shall also be liable to reimburse the Town and its officials for all costs incurred by the Town and its officials in connection with this violation, including but not limited to compensation for the animal control officer at the rate paid by the Town of Bradley, mileage expenses, the actual cost of boarding the dog in question, and reasonable attorney's fees. In no event will the fine assessed by the court be less than expenses incurred by the Town of Bradley in process of violation of this ordinance unless different penalties are provided for in Maine State statute.

*Section 1 TITLE*

This ordinance shall be known and referred to as the THE BRADLEY DOG ORDINANCE.

*Section 2 DEFINITIONS*

*Dog* shall mean both male and female.

*Owner* shall mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

*At Large* shall mean off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person by means of personal presence and attention as will reasonably control the conduct of such dog.

*Section 3 APPOINTMENT OF DOG OFFICER: DUTY*

The Board of Selectmen shall designate one (1) person to be the dog officer of the Town.  
The Dog Officer shall enforce the state and local laws regarding dogs.

*Section 4 RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED;  
RESTRAINT REQUIRED*

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, licensed or unlicensed, to permit such dog to run at large, except when used for hunting.

*Section 5 AUTHORITY TO TRANSFER TITLE TO  
UNCLAIMED DOGS*

The Town may transfer title of all dogs held by it at its animal shelter after the legal detention period has expired and the animal has not been claimed by its owner.

*Section 6 IMPOUNDMENT OF UNLICENSED DOGS OR  
DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE*

Unlicensed dogs or dogs running at large shall be taken up and impounded in a shelter designated as the Town's Animal Shelter and there confined in a humane manner for a period not to exceed fourteen (14) days.

The owner of an impounded dog shall be entitled to resume possession of such dog upon compliance with the licensing provisions set forth by the State of Maine and the payment of impoundment fees as set forth in Section 6.

Any dog impounded under the provisions of this article and not reclaimed by its owner within ten (10) days may be humanely destroyed or placed in the custody of some person deemed to be a responsible and suitable owner, who will agree to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

*Section 7 IMPOUNDMENT FEES*

Any animal impounded in accordance with this ordinance may be reclaimed as provided in Section 5 upon payment of the following fees to the Town: Impoundment fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for each animal, except that upon the second impoundment, the fee shall be ten dollars (\$10.00), and upon the third and all subsequent impoundments the fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). In addition to the

aforesaid fees, a fee for board in the amount of three dollars (\$3.00) per day for each animal will also be levied.

*Section 8 ALTERNATIVE TO IMPOUNDMENT*

When dogs are found running at large and their ownership is known, such dogs need not be impounded, but the Town may, at its discretion, cite the owners of such dogs to appear in court to answer charges of violation of this ordinance.

*Section 9 DISPOSAL OF DOG AT OWNERS  
REQUEST: FEE*

At the owner's request, which shall be in writing, dogs may be disposed of by the Town for situations not provided for in this article upon payment of a fee of five dollars (\$5.00) by the owner to the Town.

*Section 10 HEALTH OFFICER TO INVESTIGATE BITES*

The city health officer shall investigate all dog bites referred to him by the dog officer.

*Section 11 REQUIRED ACTION OF OWNER UPON HEARING OF  
HIS DOG BITING A PERSON*

It shall be unlawful for the owner or person keeping or harboring any dog, when notified that such dog has bitten any person or has caused a skin abrasion to any person, to sell or give away such dog or to permit or allow such dog to be taken beyond the town limits, except under the care of a licensed veterinarian.

It shall be the duty of such owner or keeper upon receiving notice of the character aforesaid, to immediately place such dog under confinement for a period of at least fourteen (14) days, or to deliver such dog to the dog officer. The director of public health and the city health officer shall be notified immediately by the person in charge of the death of any dog while under confinement.

It shall be unlawful for the owner or person keeping or harboring any dog when notified that such dog has bitten any person or has so injured any person as to cause abrasion of the skin to destroy such animal without permission from the city health officer.

*Section 12 IMPOUNDMENT OF BITTEN DOGS*

Any dog which shall have been bitten by another dog having or suspected of having rabies shall be immediately impounded for observation as provided in this article.

*Section 13 WHEN DOGS MAY BE KILLED;  
DISPOSITION OF CARCASS, BRAIN*

If any dangerous, fierce or vicious dog cannot be safely taken up and impounded, such dog may be slain by any policeman or authorized animal control officer. In all cases where any dog which has bitten a person or caused an abrasion of the skin of any person, is slain by any policeman whether by order of the court or otherwise and a period of less than fifteen (15) days has elapsed since the day on which such dog bit any person or caused an abrasion of the skin of any person, it shall be the duty of the policeman slaying such dog to forthwith deliver the carcass and brain to the dog officer who shall forward the brain intact to the director of public health.

*Section 14 DANGEROUS DOGS A NUISANCE;  
RESTRAINT REQUIRED*

Any dangerous dog is hereby declared to be a nuisance. The owner of any dangerous dog shall keep the same confined in a secure enclosure or on a chain or leash controlled by the owner at all times and shall not permit such dog to be at large within the town.

*Section 15 FEMALE DOGS IN HEAT*

The owner of any female dog in heat shall keep the same confined or on a leash at all times and shall not permit such dog to be at large within the town or on any premises other than those of the owner. Every female dog in heat found running at large in violation of this section shall be impounded and the owner, keeper, or person harboring such female dog in heat shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

*Section 16 BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS*

No person shall own, keep or harbor any dog which by loud, frequent or habitual barking, howling or yelping shall disturb the peace of any person.
