

2nd Half of Taxes Due

The second half of 2023 taxes are due by February 23, 2024. Unpaid taxes after that date are assessed interest at 8% per annum. Please note that you can make partial payments at any time by coming in to the office or by mail. Online payment options are also available on our website.

Homestead Exemption

If you are a legal resident of the State of Maine and have owned a homestead property for at least the past 12 months, you may qualify for a Homestead Exemption. The one-time application must be filed by April 1st. If you are not sure if you have filed, please contact the office.

Dog Registrations

All dogs 6 months and older must be registered by December 31, 2023. A state mandated late fee of **\$25.00** is **assessed after January 31, 2024**. Online payment options are available on our website.

As they do every year, the department looks to volunteers to adopt a hydrant for the winter months to assist in keeping the snow cleared for emergency access.








Winter Time

Winter Parking Regulations

No person shall allow or permit any vehicle under his or her control or registered in his or her name to stand or be parked on any public street or way from December 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024, inclusive, between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am.

No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle upon a public way within the limits of the Town of Bradley in such a manner as to interfere with or hinder plowing or removal of snow at any time.

Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.

Winter Sand Supply for Residents

Each year the Bradley Town Council allots sand to be held available to residents. Since this is a limited amount, we ask that residents take no more than 1 five-gallon bucket per **season**.

The sand is located outside the salt and sand building. Bring your own shovel and bucket.

Weekly Trash Pick Up

Normal trash collection is every
Thursday, beginning at 7:00 am.
Only household trash will be
collected. Trash must be bagged and
not weigh more than 40 pounds. If
there is a holiday during the week,
pick up will be on Friday.



Spring and Fall Clean Up

Bradley schedules two clean up opportunities per year, usually during May and October. The cost for each clean-up is \$15.00, which allows for two loads. Those loads MUST be contained, no loose trash will be accepted. Watch our website for more info.
